

Red warning- extremely heavy rain likely in Dehradun and six other districts today

PNS ■ DEHRADUN The State meteorological centre has issued a red warning (Take Action) regarding the possibility of heavy to very heavy rain likely to occur at a few places with very heavy to extremely heavy rain/thunderstorms accompanied with lightning/very intense to extremely intense spells of rain at isolated places in Dehradun, Haridwar, Pauri, Nainital, Champawat, Bageshwar and Udham Singh Nagar districts on Thursday. The meteorological centre has also issued an orange alert (Be Prepared) regarding the possibility of heavy to very heavy rain/thunderstorms accompanied with lightning/intense to very intense spells of rain likely to occur at isolated places in Uttarkashi, Tehri, Rudrapur, Chamoli, Almora and Pithoragarh districts today. Apart from this, light to moderate rain/thundershowers are likely to occur at most places in the districts of the State today. The provisional State capital Dehradun is forecast to witness a partly to generally cloudy sky. Heavy to very heavy rain is likely to occur in some areas. The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to be about 31 degrees Celsius and 23 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun today.

UP couple killed in accident on Badrinath NH

PNS ■ DEHRADUN A couple died in an accident occurred on the Badrinath National Highway near Devprayag, Tehri where a speeding car collided with a motorcycle on Wednesday. The in-charge of Devprayag police station said that the couple, hailing from Hapur, Uttar Pradesh, was returning home after their visit to Kedarnath when the accident took place. The driver also sustained some injuries who was hospitalised in the nearby hospital. He informed that both the husband and wife died on the spot due to the severity of the crash. After the locals informed the police, a team arrived at the scene and took possession of the bodies and sent them for post-mortem examination. The victims were identified as Pankaj (35) and Sangeeta (30), both residents of Hapur. He said that the collision between the car and the motorcycle was so intense that the motorcycle was completely wrecked. On the question of the cause of the accident, the official said that the car was allegedly speeding as per some locals but many also claimed that the motorcycle rider was also at fault. "The driver is currently admitted in the hospital. We will soon bring him to the police station for interrogation. The investigation into the incident is currently ongoing and we will take action accordingly," he said.

Scaling India's renewables beyond 1,500 GW will entail multiple challenges: CEEW

PNS ■ DEHRADUN India has a renewable energy (RE) potential of over 24,000 GW, but even reaching the ~7,000 GW required to achieve net-zero emissions by 2070 will require a holistic approach to addressing challenges like land access, climate risks, land conflicts and population density, according to an independent study by the Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW), entitled 'Unlocking India's RE and Green Hydrogen Potential: An Assessment of Land, Water, and Climate Nexus'. However, for India's current installed RE capacity of 150 GW, and up to 1,500 GW, the constraints are relatively manageable. Renewable energy, including solar, wind and green hydrogen, is crucial to realise India's climate goals, but scaling up these technologies will require strategic land use, improved water management and resilient power grid infrastructure. The study states that population density and land are major restrictors of India's RE potential realisation. Earthquakes are also a concern. Green hydrogen could also become very important for India's clean energy transition. Low-cost green hydrogen could be produced in western and southern India, with Gujarat leading the production with an estimated potential of 8.8 MTPA at less than USD 3.5/kg, followed by Karnataka and Maharashtra with 5 MTPA each. CEEW fellow Hemant Malia said, "Land and water are critical resources for scaling up RE and green hydrogen in India. Prevention of desertification and innovative solutions to address land availability, such as agro-voltaics in horticulture and rooftop solar in dense Indian cities, will be essential. Involving all stakeholders in the early stage of renewable project development and addressing climate risks will help ensure projects are commercially viable in the long run."

Swachhata Pakhwada event to be held on Sept 17: Arya

She said this during a virtual meeting held on Wednesday with all the Youth Affairs and Sports ministers of all the States. During the meeting, Mandaviya discussed the programmes which will be organised under the Swachhata Pakhwada on September 17. The said fortnight will commence on September 17, the birthday of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He directed the ministers that cleanliness programmes should be organised in all schools across India with the help of NSS, NCC, Bharat Scouts and Guides volunteers, he added. Arya assured the Union minister that the State government will successfully conduct the programme under Swachhata Pakhwada. She added that members of Yuvak and Mahila Mangal Dal associated with the Youth Welfare department will also provide support in the said programme. The Sports department will also help in organising various programmes in this fortnight with the aim of promoting the fit India movement. Registration of all the youth and players participating under the said Swachhata Pakhwada will also be done on the 'My Bharat Portal'.

Uttarakhand Ayurved University on the path of rejuvenation

PNS ■ DEHRADUN The Uttarakhand Ayurved University is working towards developments which will not only enhance it organisationally but also boost the professional scope for its students and Ayurved in Uttarakhand. The university will capitalise on the rising interest in Ayurved and wellness, coupled with the immense scope for this in Uttarakhand. The university's registrar Ramji Sharan Sharma said that the university is transforming to the e-office system to make the university's functioning paperless. Further, the university is also planning to upload the marksheets of its students on DigiLocker. With the marksheets of the students being made available on DigiLocker, the students will not have to bother with its verification. The marksheets will not get lost and the students will not have to visit the university to secure the document. Apart from this, the university is also focusing on ensuring timely exams and declaration of results so that the students passing out can conveniently progress on their professional path. Further, the Uttarakhand Ayurved University has also requested the Treasury to enable an automated salary system in the university, as is done in government institutions. Sharma said, "There are about 1,300 admissions per year in the university and its affiliated institutions. We have three campuses and hospitals in each of them. About 10 years ago, Ayurved was looked down upon but in recent years, people have understood its importance with Yoga and herbal medicine becoming popular across the world. Ayurved is comparatively more popular in south India. Due to factors like lack of awareness, it is less popular in the north. A State like Uttarakhand has immense scope for Ayurved and holistic healing. This can not only ensure good health of the public and also enhance the economy. This is reflected in the rising popularity of Ayurved courses," he said. Regarding the ongoing projects and plans of the university, the registrar said, "We should move towards specialisation as in fields like sports injury, for example. We are also focusing on documentation of research based knowledge and acting upon it further. The university has sent proposals for projects like Vriksh Ayurved- which entails using Ayurved for ensuring the health of flora and enhancing the potency of medicinal plants. We are also awaiting approval from the AYUSH ministry for another proposed project which will involve experimenting on 100 people by giving them a diet according to their individual Doshas- Vata, Pitta and Kapha. We want to ascertain if dietary discipline based on individual physiological compositions can do away with the need for medication generally used for lifestyle diseases," he said.
